

“The M8 rescue club is difficult to fault”

It's not often we refer to golf clubs as bargain buys. That's probably because they often cost a fortune, and because cheaper models seldom allow you to shave more than a couple of strokes off your score – not great value for money in anybody's book.

But we feel the Ben Sayers is slightly different. Firstly it costs less than £40, and secondly it has all the properties decent rescue clubs need to help golfers play better.

The shaft is pretty short compared to most of the other clubs in this test, which helps to increase control, and it gave us an air of confidence before even swinging the club. The head's a pleasant shape and has a nice appearance, plus it works bloody well. What more can a golfer want for less than £40?

We found the M8's head really effective, no matter what the lie or situation, and with some decent figures from our professional

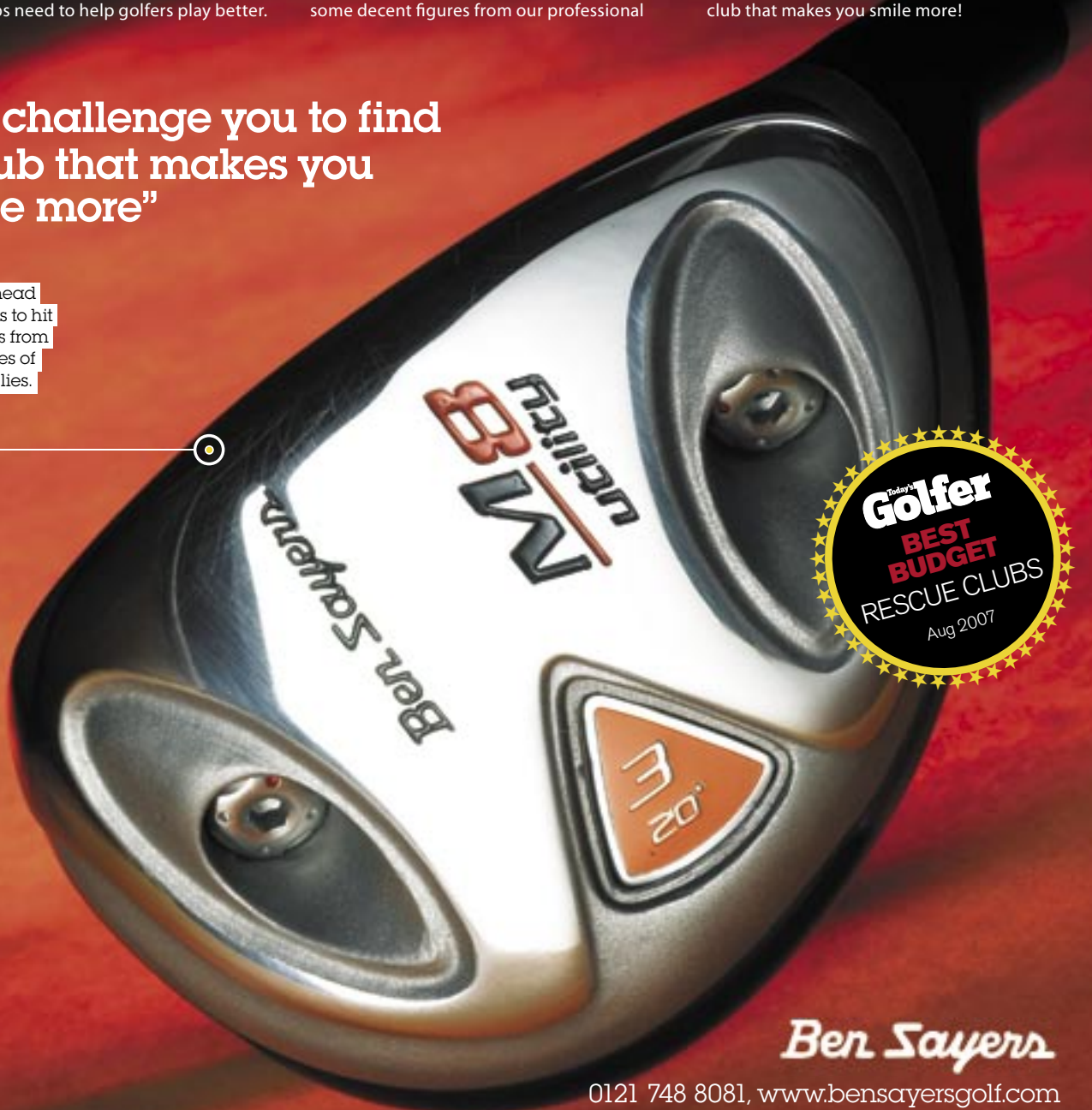
the M8 is difficult to fault.

The lightweight shaft is well suited to the slower swinging golfer, as it helps to generate spin, which in turn lifts the ball into the air to maximise carry distance.

If you've never tried a rescue club before and are wondering what all the fuss is about, you could do a lot worse than get your hands on one of these. We challenge you to find a club that makes you smile more!
